EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES

Every year, hundreds of students from our 250 partner universities in 50 countries all over the world join us to participate in one of our exchange programmes. Similarly, Windesheim students go to our partners to expand their knowledge and skills and are encouraged to experience a new country and new cultures. And besides students, we also exchange staff. This way of working empowers our faculty to continuously present state-of-the-art knowledge to our students, and gives our students an international experience which is well received by their future employers. We offer a broad range of different English-taught exchange programmes and modules in the fields of business, engineering, ICT, health care & social work, teacher education and journalism. Exchange students will also get the opportunity to study elective topics, such as Dutch language and culture. Windesheim has been awarded the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education (ECHE), which means that students and staff can take part in the Erasmus+ programme.

BACHELOR'S PROGRAMMES

Besides more than 50 Dutch BA programmes, Windesheim offers two English-taught BBA programmes. Global Project and Change Management is a selective programme for extra talented and motivated students. It focuses on the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals and personal leadership develop-

ment. After graduation, students follow a master programme or start their career in a wide variety of fields, such as circular economy, human rights and global health. The programme is offered in a small-scale and intensive setting by Windesheim Honours College. The second English-taught Bachelor's Degree programme is International Business. This BBA programme prepares students for a career in international trade (export, international marketing communication) and management. The curriculum includes intercultural management, international business management, marketing, finance, logistics, law, research and several languages. Important parts of the programme are an internship with an international company and doing projects for real businesses where students learn to apply the skills

As well as providing study opportunities, Windesheim is an important research centre. We have several thriving research institutes focusing on a variety of themes. We specialize in hands-on, practice-based research, organized in close consultation with the professional field. Health care organizations, transport companies, governments, family businesses, ICT companies as well as technical businesses are among our partners. Some examples of topics we are currently working on: family business, ICT innovations in health care, obesity prevention, education and security and plastics technology.

PROJECTS

Windesheim collaborates with international partner universities and companies in joint (cross disciplinary) projects where our students learn to work in intercultural settings. For example:

- International Weeks on campus in the fields of business, engineering, health and social work
- Short-term exchanges with partner universities
- Long-term projects in the field of sustainability in developing countries
- · Collaboration between universities, companies and institutions in 'Living labs' on smart ageing and supply chain finance

Student facilities

Windesheim is a vibrant learning community. All over the Zwolle campus, where the majority of the international students will stay, there are areas for private study and for group work. We offer state-ofthe-art facilities to our students, including student counselling, a media centre, intranet packed with news and information, a virtual learning environment, computer rooms, an audio-visual centre for borrowing laptops and AV equipment, a copy shop and a shop selling office supplies, sweets and gifts. Our students are impressed by our great sports facilities on campus: we have gyms, fitness rooms, a dojo for karate and judo, indoor football halls, a heated swimming pool and a climbing wall. On our campus we have restaurants providing fresh food and drinks. Moreover, we have a sports café and our own Grand Café offering the highly appreciated Starbucks coffee.

A 'Dutch language' course is provided to all international students, so they can learn about the language and typical habits of the Dutch. And for those who are really going for the Dutch experience by riding a bike, we also have a bike repair shop on campus.

Accommodation

Windesheim provides housing for international students in student residences close to campus and to the city centre, where students can live and study together. We work in partnership with an independent housing association specialized in student housing, which lets suitable rooms at reasonable prices.

Student buddies

Windesheim helps international students get to know the city, the Windesheim campus and Dutch (student) society. Bachelor students start their programme

with an introduction week together with all the new students, where they get to know each other, get a chance to visit the facilities on the campus and get to know all the nice spots in the city. For exchange students we have a buddy programme (Students United in the Netherlands), including an introduction week, lots of social activities during their stay in the Netherlands and a personal mentor, who helps guide them through their new student life.

THE NETHERLANDS

The Netherlands is a vibrant, multicultural country. The Dutch are open, tolerant and happy to chat, especially to people from abroad. Nearly everyone here speaks English and many people are proficient in other languages too. The Netherlands has a teaching and research culture in which freedom of expression, intellectual independence, curiosity and the right to question are paramount. The Netherlands is also known for the quality of its higher education, which delivers a highly-educated workforce to (inter)national industry, institutions and organizations. Dutch Universities of Applied Sciences have a practical approach, where problem-based learning, internships and project work for companies are important elements to prepare students for their future career.

Zwolle

Windesheim's main campus is based in Zwolle, a welcoming, lively city only one hour's drive from Amsterdam. The city is well known for its beautiful and cosy medieval city centre, with lots of cafés, restaurants, parks and shops. There are many cultural activities, including music and cultural festivals, theatre shows, movies, museums and a wide variety of sports events. Zwolle has reasonable prices for living expenses and once you've learned how to ride a bike, it's easy to get around. With a population of around 125,000, Zwolle is an important economic hub in the region.

Almere

Windesheim's newest venue (started in 2010, now 3500 students) is based in Almere, a modern and green city (200,000 inhabitants) in the fast-growing Amsterdam metropolitan area. Almere is a new town that was first built in 1976 (the newest city in the Netherlands), established between dikes, 4.5 metres below sea level. Windesheim is located in the middle of the bustling city centre, with all comforts and amenities like shops and cafés around the corner.
